

## Essential Characteristics

**Forerunner** is an excellent choice for integrated management of grazing, silage or hay.

- Preferred in Cover crop and wildlife mixes!
- Highly Palatable
- Broad long leaves that hang on
- Wide harvest window
- Excellent Yield and quality potential
- Facultative: can plant fall or spring
- Good straw strength

## Forage Versatility

In all cases for forage production appropriate aggressive amounts and timing of fertilization for the expected crop is very important. **Forerunner** is highly efficient in turning nutrients and water into forage!

**Summer seeding:** Planting in the summer months for late summer/Fall grazing. Seeding Rate: 100-150 lbs/ac. Maintain growth between 4-6 inches going into the winter months.

**Fall Seeding:** Hay or Green Chopping: Seeding rate: 80-135 lbs/ac. Timing: Depending on your conditions 9/1-11/10.

**Spring Seeding:** Seeding rate: 90-150 lbs/ac. Timing: As early as possible. 2/15-5/10.

## Cover Crop

**Forerunner** works very well in winter cover crop conditions. Its' strong root structure coupled with low growing prostrate leaves hold soils, restrict weeds and provides a firmer, less muddy work area. Seeding rates: 100-125 lbs/ac.v

## Wildlife Mixtures

When mixed with legumes and other cereals **Forerunner** is the preferred forage luring wildlife into managed areas. Its' palatability and attractive lush green color say dinner time to wildlife!
